Monthly Fly Pattern



Jerry Forck Special

Dan Bernskoetter has found a Website that shows the braid that Jerry Forck uses for his bodies for the fly. It is <http://www.123stitch.com/cgi-perl/abcSearch/search.cgi?keyword=015+braid>.

Material:

Hook: Dai Riki dry fly hook size 10-26
Thread: Brown size 8/0
Ribbing: Fine gold wire
Body: Kreinik Metallic # 8 braid
Shell back: Peacock herls
Hackle: Light olive over size dry fly hackle

Tying Instructions:

1. Crimp the barb and place the hook in the vise.
2. Start the thread just behind the eye and wrap back to the curve of the hook.
3. Secure in a piece of copper wire.
4. Secure in the hackle feather.
5. Secure in the peacock herls.
6. Secure in the body braid.
7. Wrap the thread to just behind the eye of the hook.
8. Wrap the body, secure it and trim off the excess.
9. Lay the peacock herls over the top of the body to form the shell back and secure it at the front of the fly. Trim the excess.
10. Wrap the hackle feather to the front of the hook, secure and trim off the excess.
11. Reverse wrap the rib and secure the wire at the front of the hook. Trim off the excess.
12. Create a head and whip finish.

Jerry Forck demonstrated how he tyes this fly at the WTS last Thursday night. He fishes this fly as a wet fly using either a sink tip line or a sink tip leader and drifts it most of the time. I have had luck with just a slow sink tip leader and stripping the fly down on Taney like an emerger when the trout were sipping the surface early in the morning.

Jerry has also caught a very nice bass with this fly on the Norfolk.
