Monthly Fly Pattern



Ray Charles Fly

Matt Ridenhour called me the other night to let me know about a new pattern that he had come across on the internet and was telling me how simple it was to ty. I found several versions of it on various websites and even a few ideas as to how it got its name from the theory that a blind trout can chase this fly to one which states that a blind piano player can catch fish with this fly. I don't know how much truth there was in any of these reports but I do like the simplicity of the fly. I assume that this fly can be tied weighted but did not find a version for it.

Recipe:

Hook: Mustad 3399A or any scud hook size 14-22

Thread: Uni thread 8/0 red, orange or pink **Body:** Ostrich herl, 2 to 4 stands depending on hook size. Colors are pink, gray, olive or orange depending where you are fishing.

Back: Pearl tinsel.

Rib: Most recipes do not call for ribbing but I used copper wire for durability.

Instructions

- 1. Crimp the barb.
- 2. Place the hook in the vise.
- 3. Start the thread at the front of the hook and wrap to the curve of the hook.
- 4. Secure the back material.
- 5. Secure the wire.
- 6. Secure the ostrich herl.
- 7. Wrap the thread to about 2 eye lengths from the eye.

- 8. Palmer the ostrich herl to the ty off point and secure. Remove excess.
- 9. Lay the tinsel across the back of the herl and secure at the eye.
- 10. Wrap the rib to the eye and secure.
- 11. Whip finish and cement the head.

Matt assures me that it will catch fish. It is a very simple sow bug or scud imitation. Try them and let me know how they work.
