Mid MO TU is having George Daniel present a seminar on his book Dynamic Nymphing on Saturday, March 9th, 2013 in Columbia. George is a two-time US National Fly Fishing Champion and a member of Fly Fishing Team USA. He is head coach for the NC Fly Fishing

Team and employed by the TCO State College Fly Shop.

The seminar is open to the open to the public and will be held at the new Conservation Research Center on 3500 E. Gans Road in Columbia, MO. It will begin at 9:00am and run until Noon.

Annual Banquet

Ringo's Wellness Class

Linda Ringo is a retired P E teacher who continues to work with a class of high school students teaching a special class. The students in Linda's class spend a period going about the community learning about what goes on outside of the classroom. They will visit in the County Jail, in senior care facilities, Samaritan Center, the Salvation Army Center, the bowling alley and they also come to Binder Park where CCFF Members spend one hour a day for a week teaching them how to fly and cast a fly rod. The class usually has about 15 to 25 members and is usually a 50% /50% young men to young ladies ratio. The women are as competitive when they get around to fishing on the final day of the session.

A to Z Fly Fishing Class

This year's course will again be held at the Runge Nature Center and will begin on April 11. The class will meet at 6:00pm and last until 8:00pm on the second and fourth Thursday of April, May and June. The class is free and open to the first 15 applicants to register at Runge. Applicants must be at least 12 years old and accompanied by an adult if under 16. All equipment and materials will be furnished by the Capital City Fly Fishers. The text for the course will be "Fly Fishing A-Z" by Mark Van Patten. The course will cover the fundamentals of the sport of fly fishing both warm water and cold water. It will cover such subjects as equipment, casting, fly tying, safety, entomology and conservation. Some of the instruction will be held outdoors. Monthly Fly Pattern



White River Demon

Another fly that I found in my copy of "Woolly Wisdom" recently was Tony Spezio's WRD. Tony says he accidentally invented this fly while he was using up leftover material from his tying bench.

After spending an hour catching 2 trout, he decided to change patterns and caught a 15 inch rainbow on his first cast. He then proceeded to catch eight fish on his next eight casts.

Material:

Hook: Eagle Claw LO58 size 8 to 14

Head: 4-mm silver plastic bead

Weight: 10 wraps of .010 to .015 lead free wire jammed into the bead.

Thread: Fluorescent red

Tail: White rabbit fur

Hackle: White or cream, palmered

Body: Pearl plastic canvas braid tied at the front and wrapped to the rear and back

Collar: Fluorescent red thread

Eyes: Yellow with black pupil

Tying Instructions:

1. Crimp the barb of the hook and place the bead on the hook.
2. Place about 10 turns of weighted wire jamming it up against the bead.
3. Place a drop of superglue on the wire and then start wrapping the

thread on top of the wire and wrap to the rear of the hook.

4. Select a bundle rabbit fur as you would a bundle of marabou for a Woolly Bugger and ty it in.

5. Select a hackle and ty it in

6. Wrap the thread forward to just behind the bead and secure the body material.

7. Wrap the body braid back to the rear of the hook and then back to the thread and secure the braid. Remove the excess..

8. Palmer the hackle forward to the bead and secure it.

9. Wrap a collar and whip finish the fly

10. Add eyes to the bead head using Slick fabric paint.

Tony says that the fly is slightly buoyant because of the plastic bead and the double wrapping of the body but it does sink slowly. He recommends strip retrieving with short strips.

Try it. You may like it.
