## Fly of the Month

Pattern from the March 2006 Fly Fisherman magazine page 67 by John Barr

Name : The Meat Whistle

### Material

Hook: # 1/0 Gamakatsu 90-degree jig hook

Cone: Large copper

Thread: Rusty-brown 140-denier Ultra Thread

Body: Copper Diamond Braid

Rib: Copper-brown Ultra Wire

Wing: Rust rabbit strip (4" long for this size hook)

Legs: Pumpkin Barred Sili –Legs

Flash: Copper Flashabou

Collar: Brown marabou

Extra: Can add the kitchen sink

### Tying Instructions

1. Crimp the barb, slip on the cone and place the hook in the vise.
2. Put a thread base on the hook and install the wire and braid at the rear of the hook.
3. Wrap the body braid to the cone and ty off.
4. Invert the hook and install the fur strip by piercing a slit in the fur strip and threading it onto the hook with just enough at the front to go to the front of the hook and the other 3-1/2" trailing the hook curve. Ty off the fur strip behind the cone.
5. Segment the body by wrapping the body with the rib wire and ty off at the cone.
6. Turn the hook over and ty in the sili-legs.
7. Ty in a small group of Flashabou and distribute it around the hook so that it extends back and is trailing on all sides of the hook. It should reach back to the curve of the hook.
8. Ty in a bunch of marabou on top of the hook to reach from the cone to just behind the curve of the hook.
9. Rotate the hook and ty in a similar bunch on the bottom of the hook.
10. Whip finish the bundle and cement.
11. Press the cone back against the marabou, Flashabou and sili-leg bundle and wrap a few turns of thread in front of the cone to hold it in place. Whip finish and cement the cone.
