## Monthly Fly Pattern



**Bristol Emerger**

### Material:

Hook – Dai-Riki 305 size 14-16

Thread –Black size 8/0

Body—Gold Tinsel

Ribbing----Copper wire

Thorax--- Squirrel

Wing Case---Orange Krystalflash bundled

Hackle---Hen

### Tying Instructions:

1. Debarb and place hook in vise.
2. Start the thread wraps immediately behind the eye and wrap to the curve of the hook.
3. Secure the gold tinsel and the ribbing wire. Wrap the thread back to the 75% point of the hook.
4. Wrap the tinsel to the 75% point and secure. Remove excess.
5. Wrap the copper wire to the 75% point and secure. Remove the excess.
6. Form a dubbing noddle of squirrel and create a thorax.
7. Bundle a group of Krystalflash and secure one end to the hook.
8. Wrap in one end of the hackle feather.
9. Make a couple of turns of the hackle feather and secure.
10. Secure the hackle and whip finish.
