CCFF members man Checkpoint #6 of the MR340 Race

July 25-26 Many of the CCFF members volunteered to monitor and provide cold water for the racers of the kayak/canoe race from Kansas City to St Charles Missouri. About 92 individuals paddled the 340 miles from KC to St Charles.

The tandem crew of West Hansen and Richard Steppe made it in 44.27 hours. The Men's Solo winner was Dave Anderson with a time of 46.21 hours and the Women's Solo winner was Erin Magee with a time of 55.33 hours. Many of the racers were from other states or countries. One man was from Poland and a tandem kayak was from Canada.

A 70 year old couple from San Francisco, California were not able to finish the race because they went under a fuel barge, that was coming upstream as they were going downstream, about 1:00 am in the morning near Gasconade, MO. They lost their kayak but were pulled to safety from the river by the barge crew without injury.

Unlike Lewis and Clark, I don't think that any of the racers stopped very long to fish during their trip. A few even stopped long enough to sleep.

The Race Organizers have rendered their thanks to the CCFF for furnishing volunteers to man the Checkpoint and represent Jefferson City. They are looking forward to doing this again next year.

Fly of the Month

The Renegade

Materials:

Hook: Mustad 94840 size 10-16.

Thread: olive 14/0.

Hackle: rear brown cape, front white neck

Body: peacock herl **Tag**: flat gold tensil

Instructions

- Step 1 Crimp down the barb of the hook. It is not needed and will only cause problems if it gets stuck in you or a friend.
- Step 2 Place hook in vise and wrap thread to curve of the hook.
- Step 3 Ty in gold tensil and wrap 2 turns of it.
- Step 4 Ty off tensil and ty in the brown hackle feather and the peacock body herl.
- Step 5 Wrap the thread and peacock 1/3 of the way up the hook. Secure the peacock and wrap the brown hackle over the peacock to the 1/3 point and secure the hackle. Trim off the excess hackle
- Step 6 Wrap the peacock and thread to the 2/3 point of the hook and ty in the white hackle.
- Step 7 Wrap the peacock and thread to within 1 hook eye of the hook eye. Secure the peacock and trim excess peacock.
- Step 8 Wrap the white hackle over the body to head of the fly and secure the hackle.

 Trim the excess hackle and whip finish a head.

This is an old and reliable fly. I have seen results from it last week in size 16 at Bennette Springs. I also had good results last month at Taneycomo tyed in size 10. It just depends on what is hatching.
