CCFF Members worked on Mill Creek Bohigian Area

On September 21, the Missouri Conservation Heritage Foundation held a dedication ceremony officially designating a portion of Mill Creek as the Bohigian Conservation Area in Phelps County. Dr. Bohigian and Chris were on hand as were several dignitaries from MDC, the Mid Mo TU, the Ozark FFF, the Midwest FFF, the Roubidoux FFF, the CCFF and other Federal and Missouri Government Officials. There were about forty people in attendance. Members of the CCFF and Mid Mo TU prepared a fine lunch of salmon on a cedar plank along with roasted corn, salad, cobbler and all of the trimmings. Maybe we can get "Chef Van Patten" to heat up some cedar planks for a summer sometime.

On September 15, CCFF Members Sam Smith, Jim Farthing, Lee Kudnra, Mark Van Patten, John

Wenzlick, Jeff Holzem and Jerry Kemple assisted the MDC with the fabrication of nine sky hooks at the Bohigian Area of Mill Creek in Phelps County.



These sky hooks are wooden ledges that will be buried in the bank of the creek for the purpose of providing cover for the fish in the creek. The bank will overhang the sky hook and allow a shaded area where the fish can hide from predators.

Fly of the Month

The Beaded Marabou Leech

Materials:

Hook: Mustad 9672 size 4-10

Thread: Wine 8/0.

Bead: Gold sized for hook

Body: Black, brown or olive marabou

Instructions

- Step 1** Crimp down the barb of the hook. It is not needed and will only cause problems if it gets stuck in you or a friend.
- Step 2** Place bead on the hook and place the hook in the vise.
- Step 3** Wrap the hook from the bead to the back of the hook with the thread.
- Step 4** Ty in a group of marabou barbs form a feather to form a tail about the length of the hook.
- Step 5** Wrap the thread around the remainder of the bundle of marabou and wrap the bundle around the hook moving forward. When you run out of barbs, add more and wrap with thread as wrapping forward until you get to the bead.
- Step 6** Whip finish the fly and cement the thread.

This is fly that take very little material. It may not be as good as mohair but it is simple to ty.

Wrapping the bundle of barb helps to make the fly more durable.
