

The following information was sent out to me last week and has a deadline. My apologies for the short notice, but please read this over. If you are interested please let me know by Saturday, January 22.

The Conservation Federation of Missouri (CFM) is seeking one nominee per affiliate to fill up to 12 (twelve) positions on the CFM board of directors. These board positions will represent ALL affiliates and carry out the duties expected of a board member of a non-profit organization.

Background:

At the March 2016 Board of Directors meeting, the board voted to make changes to the make-up of the BOD. These went into effect leading up to the March 2018 Convention. These changes impact how affiliates are represented. Instead of affiliates with greater than 250 members automatically receive a seat on the BOD, up to 12 representatives will be nominated and elected by affiliates. These 12 individuals will represent ALL affiliates.

A workgroup of affiliates worked to develop the nomination and election process.

In preparation for the affiliate board elections, a nominating committee has been formed of volunteers from several affiliate organizations. The committee's role is to solicit CFM affiliations to submit ONE nominee to run for election as a CFM board member. These elected positions will serve a 3, 2, or 1-year term. Nominees are required to be a member of a CFM affiliate in good standing.

Nomination Process:

Each affiliate may submit one nomination. As an organization, decide how you want to choose your nominee. The nomination must be

submitted from the affiliate using the nomination form provided on this website. It is your nominee's responsibility to read and understand the board member's job description and expectations.

Submit nominations, using the online form https://confedmo.org/affiliate-board-elections/ not later than the close of business on January 25, 2022, on the CFM website. Contact Michelle Gabelsberger at majabelsberger@confedmo.org if you have any issues.

The nominating committee will review each nomination to ensure qualifications are met and will provide the list of nominees to affiliates in about mid-February.

The Nominees will be asked to provide: Photo, Bio, and a 90-second video.

Voting ID number

Will be arriving in the mail in the next few weeks. If you have any questions or didn't get it in the mail. Contact me to get your Voting ID number.

Nominees will be voted on for CFM affiliate board positions by an online voting ballot and then announced at the annual affiliate luncheon at the March Convention, one vote per affiliate.
