Stream Team Update

Water Quality Monitoring - Saturday April 5 6:15 am

We will meet at the Assembly of God Parking lot on Route C near Schulte's Fresh Foods. Then we will carpool to big Saline Creek in Miller County off of Highway 17. We will all have a donut and set up our equipment on a gravel bar. We will conduct some chemical tests and count bugs. Then we will measure the flow. That was a challenge last time because we were in a serious drought, but we found a surprising number of insects, maybe because the water was so low, or because Uldis brought a rake. After we finish the water quality monitoring and picking up trash, those of us who want to fish will drive to Bennett Spring. 
Guest Speaker for April 8th Meeting
