OUTINGS

The dates, times, and locations for our summer outings are now set. The first outing will be held on Tuesday, May 10, between 5 and 9 pm at the Binder Park Lake Deck Pavilion. It will be a potluck, so we ask that each household bring something to have alongside the pork steaks that John Walther will be preparing. Mike Dean will bring drinks in the form of water, tea, and soda. If you require any other type of beverage then you will need to bring it with you. We need to know how many pork steaks to make, so it would be appreciated if you could tell me if you will be attending this potluck. All household members are welcome to attend, we just need to know how many that will be. So we don't end up with a lot of the same types of dishes or desserts, it would also be nice to know what you are bringing to the festivities. We will have a social hour starting at 5 pm and eat around 6 pm. Over the next few weeks I will send out a series of reminders.

The second outing will be Tuesday, June 14, between 5 and 9 pm at Jaycee County Park (Fairgrounds Park) in the upper pavilion. This will be our annual pizza party. STREAM TEAM UPDATE

Stream Team Update:

We had a great crew to monitor Saturday! Greg and Phil Curtin, Rick Thom, Doug Grove, Mike Dean, Uldis Pironis and I had plenty time to eat donuts, check the water quality and pick up 2 big bags of trash. We worked on all three tests, macroinvertebrates, stream discharge, and water chemistry at the same time and finished by 11. That gave Greg, Doug and me time fish at the lake, where Greg caught a couple nice fish. The bug sampling produced another good water quality rating. Dissolved oxygen at 9 ppm was excellent and we found no nitrate concentration. I even provided a bit of comic entertainment. While attempting to catch the ball for stream discharge, I checked my watch to time the flow and missed the ball. The water was moving fairly fast, so I started running after it but tripped on an unseen rock and went down, but I got up fast and caught it. Fortunately, we had a first aid kit, and I had dry clothes at the lake. Overall, it was a good day.

If you have not had a chance to view the online training, check it out I found the training online at this site, 01 Intro to VWQM Introduction

You will see there are 6 separate modules for the introductory class and several for other levels. I really enjoyed learning about watersheds and going out to monitor. If you do not want to attend classes in person, these videos are a great way to learn the material at your own pace. You can do the field work later to get certified.

Montana Fly fishing guide Hillary Hutechson starred in and produced a video https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VZmOZL5Vo40 that follows a drop of water from the continental divide to the pacific. She began on the mountain with a famous skier. Then she fished and floated with various other guides all the way to coast. She spoke of the need to protect the rivers and preserve them for our kids.
