Monthly Fly Pattern



The Green Hornet

John sent me this pattern from Tommy Hargrove's website. Tom credits Davy Wotton for the pattern and says Davy is very successful with it on the White river system.

Material:

Hook: TMC 2487, size14-22

Thread: Black 8/0- 12/0

Bead Head: 5/64 tungsten, silver or nickel

Body: Black Wapsi Span-Flex

Ribbing: Fine wire, silver or gold

Tail: White marabou

Thorax: Wapsi SLF Prism, Color: peacock (194)

Tying Instructions:

1. Crimp the barb and place the bead on the hook
2. Place the hook in the vise and wrap a layer of thread passed the curve of the hook.
3. Tie in a piece of marabou about the length of the hook.
4. Tie in the ribbing and the span flex
5. Wrap the thread to the 2/3 point of the hook.
6. Wrap the span flex to the 2/3 point and secure.
7. Counter wrap the ribbing about 5 turns and secure.
8. Dub in the thorax and whip finish and cement the head.

Tom says this pattern stings just like the origin Green Hornet did.
