STREAM TEAM UPDATE

On Saturday, April 17, Greg and his Dad, Phil Curtin, Rick Thom and I met in the Assembly of God parking lot at 7am. Phil checked out the free garage "sale" where he got a book on fishing and a couple more freebies. After a few donuts we drove to Saline Creek to monitor. The first thing we noticed was how much more erosion had happened since our last trip.

On the positive side the water quality rating is 21. Good is between 18 and 23 and above 23 is excellent. A good rating requires a diversity of insect species. Poor quality water can support only pollution tolerant bugs. We found small numbers overall but at least one Stonefly, Mayfly, Caddis, Gilled Snail, and Water Penny, which all require clean water. The stream was high after Friday's rain, but very clear. Dissolved oxygen was 10.5 ppm, which is excellent. Nitrates remained low and the PH was slightly basic. As usual we picked up a large bag of trash. Overall we got very good results on what turned out to be a pleasant sunny day. Thanks to Rick, Greg and Phil for a job well done!
