
Fundraising and Entertainment:

AUGUST MEMBERS MEETING

The August members meeting falls right after the banquet on August 8th. There is a lot of important information that needs to be discussed. Here they are broken down:

Bylaws

The most immediate topic is the vote to approve changes in the bylaws.

On August 8th, when we again commence to have our regular meetings, we need to get a vote from a quorum of the membership (20% of members) to comply with Article X: Amendments to Bylaws, Section 2: Amendments of bylaws by membership only, a. Bylaws fixing or changing the number of directors; and d. Bylaws fixing or changing the term of directors.

Our proposed amendments will eliminate the office of Past President and replace this position with an additional regular director that is not an officer. This will increase the number of regular directors from five (5) to six (6), with the total number of the Board of Directors remaining the same at eleven (11). Also, the terms of the regular directors will change from a term of two years to a term of three years, with two regular directors being elected each year. We will then have two regular directors serving three-year terms, two regular directors serving two-year terms, and two regular directors serving one-year terms.

If everything goes well at the August meeting, we will be on schedule to adopt the newly amended Bylaws at the September 12, 2023 meeting.

Forming a Banquet/Fundraising Committee

If we are going to try and get back on track and have a fundraising banquet earlier in the year for 2024, then we need to get the ball rolling now. As most of you know it takes time to put everything

together for a banquet and to acquire donations. We must get a committee formed to focus on this event and other possible fundraising events. Committee members need to come from both the Board of Directors and the regular members. We will want to have six (6) members on the committee. A lot has to be done, so we need to start now. Thank you in advance!

Officers and Elections

As was briefly mentioned last month, for the club to continue on, we must find new officers. Specifically, a president and vice-president will be needed at the next election. The current President and Vice-President will have reached their 4 consecutive years limit at the end of this year. We will need to have an election/nomination committee to search for candidates. Nominations are in October and the election is in November. Please continue to make this a great club!

Other

We could also talk about other topics as well. Topics like, needing volunteers for Women's Free Fishing Day, Setting up a time for Stream Team Monitoring, planning an outing, looking at more events to promote fly fishing, conservation, and the club, or any topic deemed needed.

WOMEN'S FREE FISHING DAY

Thank you to everyone who helped put the fly boxes together for Women's Free Fishing Day. Because of the large turnout, we were able to fill 100 fly boxes with 8 flies each. If you have flies you were working on, no need to worry. We can still use them at the table during the event or start building a supply for next year. We would like to have people for Fly tying Demonstrations, handing out fly boxes, and any other general help needed.


