STREAM TEAM UPDATE

Alaska report:

You do not expect Alaska to be hot, but it set all time heat records just before Greg and I arrived. There had been no rain for over a month, the streams were low and too warm. We saw wildfire smoke from the air around Anchorage. A normally good King Salmon stream was 70 degrees and the kings avoided it. Fortunately, the sockeye salmon came up the river in good numbers and we were fortunate enough to have some great fights. The average sockeye is around three pounds, but Greg fought a seven pounder for 20-25 minutes before our guide netted it way down stream. If you do not let them run or you grab the reel as they are stripping line, they will break you off. As temperatures keep rising I am not sure how much longer we will be able to enjoy great salmon and trout fishing in Alaska, but I am thankful we were able to catch some nice fish there.
