Monthly Fly Pattern



John Wilson's Trout Crack

I just got my 4th quarter copy of Fly Fisherman Magazine and it had an article in it about Arkansas football. No really the article was about fishing the White River but it was written by Zach Matthews who is still lamenting about the last time that the Razorbacks beat South Carolina. That is the way it is in the SEC. Good luck Missouri!

I have featured the Trout Crack in the past but thought that it might be worth mentioning again for those making the December Outing. This is another one of those simple patterns to ty.

Recipe:

Hook: Tiemco 14-20
Thread: Clear or smoky mono
Dubbing: Tan antron
Shell: Brown vinyl D-rib

Tying Instructions:

1. Crimp the barb and place the hook in the vise.
2. Wrap the thread from the eye to about half way down the rear of the hook.
3. Lay the vinyl on the top of the hook and wrap over it to the front of the hook. You will have part of the vinyl extending out from the rear of the hook and part secured by your thread to the shank of the hook.
4. You are now ready to dub the body. Sparsely dub the thread and wrap it to the rear of the hook.
5. Lay the vinyl over the top of the body and wrap a rib to the head of the fly.

6. Secure the vinyl at the front of the hook and whip finish a head.
7. Let a very short portion of the rib extend beyond the head and cut excess rib and thread.
8. Cement the head.

John Wilson believes that most commercial scud patterns are overdressed.
