


MESSAGE FROM THE PREZ

DECEMBER (CHRISTMAS) MEETING

December 13th is the annual Christmas Potluck. All club members and their family are invited to take part in the festivities. Please bring a dish, side, or dessert to share with the group. We will be at the KC Hall on Tanner Bridge Road. The same place as our regular meetings. We will begin the meal at 6 pm and go to around 7 pm.

After eating, we will have our traditional gift giving. For those who are not familiar with the gift giving process, here's how it goes:

Each person that brings a gift will be eligible to receive a gift. Gifts should be something that you yourself would want to receive. Gifts can be anything, not just fishing related. Not only have we had fly fishing related gifts, but also household items, foods, decorations, clothing, crafts, and many other items.

Gifts should be around \$10. They can be higher as long as you understand that not all gifts will have the same higher value.

Gifts should be wrapped so no one can see what it is. Everyone will draw a number to determine the order of selecting gifts. Once the first person selects the next number in sequence is up. That person can select a gift off the table or have the option to steal a previously selected gift. After the second steal of a gift, that gift is frozen and can no longer be stolen. It's yours!

If your gift is stolen, you then have the option to pick something off the table or steal someone else's pick. If you draw off the table you could have that item stolen in the future as well and you will go once again.

This will go on until everyone has had a turn and ends up with a gift. Everyone is welcome to participate.
