#### Fly of the Month

#### **Olive Zonker**

Material:

Hook: Mustad 9272 Size 2-10

Thread: 3/0 red and olive

Body & tail: Gold Mylar tubing

Hackle: Olive dyed grizzly

Wing: Olive rabbit fur strip

#### **Tying Instructions**

1. Crimp barb and place the hook in the vise.

## Photos from DARE 2004

2. Weight hook with 11 turns of .030 wire
3. Cover hook and weight with red thread and stop at the rear of the hook
4. Push the Mylar tubing over the hook and extend an unraveled portion 3/8" past the curve of the hook
5. Wrap the rear of the tubing with the red thread and hold red thread at this location for a later operation
6. Wrap the olive thread hook eye and wrap over the front end of the Mylar
7. Wrap over the front end of the rabbit strip and allow the strip to extend one hook length beyond the curve.
8. Tie off the front end of the strip and whip finish the olive thread
9. Wrap the rabbit strip at the rear of the hook with the red thread (there should be a strip extending beyond the curve of the hook by as much as is extended forward)
10. Whip finish the red thread and cement both the red and the olive thread.
