DECEMBER MEETING

Are you ready for some Christmas cheer? I hope you are because we will be having a potluck Christmas party for the December members meeting. It was decided that the meeting would start at 6 pm with a potluck style supper. Please bring a dish, dessert, or side to share with everyone. The meeting is set for Tuesday, December 14th, at the KC Hall's basement meeting room on Tanner Bridge Road.

After eating, we will have our traditional gift giving. For those who are not familiar with the gift giving process, here's how it goes:

Each person that brings a gift will be eligible to receive a gift. Gifts should be something that you yourself would want to receive. Gifts can be anything, not just fishing related. Not only have we had fly fishing related gifts, but also household items, foods, decorations, clothing, crafts, and many other items.

Gifts should be around \$10. They can be higher as long as you understand that not all gifts will have the same higher value.

Gifts should be wrapped so no can see what it is. Everyone will draw a number to determine the order of selecting gifts. Once the first person selects the next number in sequence is up. That person can select a gift off the table or have the option to steal a previously selected gift. After the second steal of a gift, that gift is frozen and can no longer be stolen. It's yours!

If your gift is stolen, you then have the option to pick something off the table or steal someone else's pick. If you draw off the table you could have that item stolen in the future as well and you will go once again.

This will go on until everyone has had a turn and ends up with a gift. I hope everyone will participate.

STREAM TEAM UPDATE

On Saturday, October 30, Greg and Phil Curtain, Lee Kudrna, Raymond Bloomer and I monitored our stream, Big Saline Creek. The weather was great and our work went smoothly. We did not find many bugs in the first net set, but got more each of the next two times. Most of them were mayflies, but we got a few caddis, even a case caddis, a couple water pennies and snails along with some aquatic worms. The insect diversity gave us the top fair rating, but below good and excellent. Dissolve oxygen was 9ppm and nitrogen was low. Conductivity and PH were fine. The flow was higher after rain the week before, but the water was clear. We picked up several bags of trash around the parking area. Unfortunately, there was a truck battery and tire below the low water crossing as well as a lot more trash. I will ask the stream team leader to send out a crew to clean it up.

I think the flooding and silting in of pools contributes to lack of smallmouth. Greg and I fished downstream, while Phil and Lee went up. It was good to get in the water, have donuts and catch something (including an 8 inch shad). I think Lee caught the most but we all had a good time.
